Approval of the November 9th, 2021 Regular Council Meeting:

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DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Public Works Director David Windham said that the City of Butler's Annual Christmas Tree Lighting was held on November 30th and was very successful.

The dumpsters that are placed around the City of Butler for the holiday trash overload will be placed around town the week before Christmas. They will be located on the northern portion of the City around Venus Street, in the area of Tower/Cedar Street, and in the Railroad/MLK area. The regular trash pickup dates will remain the same (Friday) on December 24th and January 31st.

City Hall will be closed on Thursday, December 23rd, Friday, December 24th, Monday December 27th and Friday, December 31st for the Holidays.

He said that the repairs to the various street holes have been completed across the City of Butler.

The City of Butler is looking forward to 2022.

Councilperson Deborah Williams informed Mr. Windham that on Ridge Street where you exit off of MLK that there is a dip in the road and is concerned that the road could be sinking in that area. The Public Works Department will check into this issue.

Chief Matthew Woodard said that the Butler Police Department had 51 calls in November and issued 41 citations during the month. He also said that all Butler Police Department Officers have completed all of their required training for 2021, and that each officer has between 60 to 100 hours of training.

David Windham, Fire Chief for Fire Coordinator Eddie Moulton said that the Fire Department ran sixteen calls in November. Those calls were five vehicle accidents, three cancelled en-route calls, three wildland fires, two structure fires, two odor calls, and one electric fire.

He also said that the Butler Fire Department has been awarded a \$5000.00 Grant from Flint Energies. This will be used to purchase some much needed turn-out gear for the firefighters.
